Organizational Overview:

Restorative Partners, Inc. (RP) is a nonprofit organization that transforms lives impacted by crime through healing services and relationships. We believe in accompanying and supporting anyone affected by crime on their healing journey and to be an instrument of restoration and accountability. We believe that violence is never a solution to any problem and that every person is endowed with a sacred dignity, and is capable of changing, healing, and being restored. We believe that everyone deserves to be treated with respect and dignity. We believe that we can overcome violence with education, love, and compassion.

Job Overview

The Respite Volunteer's primary responsibility is first and foremost that the house is a recovery home and works a 12 step social and MAR model program. The RV works closely with the Restorative Partner's Housing Team to ensure a safe, secure, trauma-informed, clean, and sober living environment for people in recovery and reentry. Respite Volunteers facilitate, within the house, open lines of communication while maintaining accountability with residents. All work is done with an understanding and practice of a Restorative Justice approach to internal and external, employee, and partner relationships.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities

- 9 PM - 6:30 AM
- Assist with breathalyzing nightly and perform UA testing as needed
- Maintain a solid program of recovery in the home
- Ensure curfew and lights out enforcement
- Provide overnight and general supervision of house residents, especially during the resident blackout period
- Monitor resident behavior/progress and communicate any concerns according to Emergency On-Call Protocol
- Assist in the distribution of medication and input data in the daily medication log
- Embody house expectations and monitor/ensure compliance in the residence
- Participate in required training onboarding training, County RRH training, CPR/1st aid, and MI Training

Other Duties and Responsibilities

- Attend periodic training and staff meetings

Knowledge, Skills, Talents, & Abilities

- Valid Driver's License and Insurance
- At least one year clean and sober with a thorough understanding of the recovery process including step work, sponsors, meeting schedules, locations and attendance
- Understands the basic principles of the Restorative Justice approach to the criminal justice system through participation in RP training
- Attend at least 2 recovery meetings (NA or AA) per week
- If on Probation or Parole, must have a letter of support from the officer or agent
- Clearance from CDCR

- Not currently a client of SLO County Drug & Alcohol Services
- High School Diploma or equivalency
- Must agree to Mandatory Vaccination Policy
